Following its official authorisation of the IB PYP, ABS was encouraged by the IB to allow Grade 6 to rejoin the Middle Years School in order to complete the 5 years of the MYP that is common in most IB schools. So Grades 6-10 will follow the MYP, before joining the College to take either the IB Diploma or IB Courses or Career Programme in Grades 11 and 12.

STUDENTS ENTERING GRADE 6 AT ABS WILL BENEFIT FROM THE FOLLOWING

- International Section enrolment
- Specific Science instruction taught by specialised teachers
- Mathematics instruction in the English language (in the JS, Maths is taught in Arabic)
- More classes in language instruction in the MYS
- History can be taught in Arabic for bilingual students
- An early exposure to valuable extra-curricular activities such as Model United Nations, Round Square, Performing Arts and Sports Teams
- Later start to the school day, at 9:00 am
- One-on-one Support lessons for all subjects are offered every morning between 8 – 9 for any interested students

THE INTERNATIONAL SECTION IN THE MIDDLE YEARS SCHOOL TARGETS THE FOLLOWING TYPE OF STUDENTS

- The children of expatriate parents living in Jordan on a temporary basis who wish their children to have an IB education.
- The children of non Jordanian families living in Jordan who do not have the necessary language ability in Arabic to cope with our bilingual programme.
- The children of Jordanian families who do not have the level of Arabic to cope with our bilingual programme. These children will have been educated outside of Jordan or have been attending non-Arabic speaking schools.

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
